New Board Director from Sault Ste. Marie Joins North East LHIN Board of Directors

March 12, 2015 – New Board Director Toni Nanne-Little, appointed by an Order in Council, has joined the North East Local Health Integration (LHIN) Board for a three year term.

The Sault Ste. Marie resident is a long-time educator who spent the bulk of her career with the Huron-Superior Catholic School Board as a teacher, principal and then Superintendent. In addition to having taught Grades 1 to 11, Nanne-Little also lectured for two years as an adjunct professor at Lake Superior State University's School of Education. After more than 30 years, she retired in 2013 from the Huron-Superior Board and took a contract position with the Ministry of Education as an officer responsible for implementing student success initiatives in Boards throughout the region.

QUICK FACTS

- The North East LHIN is responsible for planning, integrating, coordinating and providing funding to 145 health service providers in Northeastern Ontario. It oversees \$1.4-billion in local health care investments on behalf of the 565,000 residents of Northeastern Ontario.
- LHIN Directors are appointed by Order-In-Council for a term of up to three years, subject to a two-term maximum. The Board of Directors is accountable, through the Chair, to the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care for the LHIN's use of public funds and for its results in terms of goals and performance of the local health system.
