Jérémy has held numerous positions in the Ontario Health sector, including: Chief Operating Officer of the St-Francis Memorial Hospital (SFMH) in Barry's Bay. Prior to that, he was respectively Senior Planner with the Champlain Local Health Integration Network and Executive Planning Advisor & Assistant to the President and CEO at the Hôpital Montfort in Ottawa.

He has been a member of the Ontario Hospital Association's (OHA) *Small, Rural and Northern Hospitals Provincial Leadership Council*. In 2012, he was awarded the OHA Small, Rural and Northern Healthcare Excellence Award in recognition of SFMH's innovative leadership in collaborating and establishing partnerships to expand and improve health services in the Madawaska Valley. Jeremy was also recently awarded the National Award from the Canadian College of Health Leaders.

Jérémy is fluently bilingual. He is the proud father of four children and stays involved in community life – volunteering, coaching sport leagues, and remaining involved with the University of Ottawa MHA program and the provincial leadership committees.

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
