



Chief Executive Officer

The North East Local Health Integration Network (North East LHIN) is one of the largest of 14 LHINs in Ontario, responsible for planning, integrating and funding of health care services for more than 565,000 people across an estimated 400,000 square kilometers. From offices across Northeastern Ontario, they are a provincial crown corporation that ensures the local health care system works when people need it. The North East LHIN brings close to 150 of our region's health care partners together – hospitals, home and community care, mental health and addictions, community health centres, and long-term care homes.

The governance structure includes a board of fellow Northerners that work to improve local health care. This year, home and community care services and staff transferred from Community Care Access Centres (CCACs) to Local Health Integration Networks. Home and community care services are now provided through Ontario's 14 Local Health Integration Networks (LHINs). LHINs plan, integrate and fund local health care. The North East LHIN now consists of approximately 750 staff with responsibility for direct delivery of patient services in the home and community sector.

As the organization evolves to integrate new community care services and staff from North East CCAC to the North East LHIN, the CEO's overall mandate is to lead the Local Health Integration Network in the fulfillment of its mandate in accordance with the Local Health System Integration Act, including leading the innovation of a patient- and client-centred local health system through the planning, coordination, integration and funding of all health services, including primary care, home and community care services as well as community support services, leading the delivery of home and community care services and long term care placements, and the integration of population and public health in local health planning. The CEO provides overall leadership for the recommendation, development and implementation of a comprehensive strategy to ensure the delivery of home and community care, to address the distinct needs of the LHIN region, and improve the patient experience. The CEO leads the organization in achieving the Board-approved strategic plan and recommends new initiatives to the Board.

The successful candidate will possess a Master's degree in health administration, public administration or related field. In addition, he/she will have a minimum of 10 years of progressive professional and leadership experience in the health sector with several years of experience in a senior executive leadership role and working with Boards of Directors. Bilingualism in English and French is required.
